

## Notes & News From the 5/7/20 Church Council Meeting

1. In view of the Governor's extension of the "Safer at Home" order through May, we may not be able to have **worship services in May**. However, there have been requests for lifting some of the restrictions that could affect the current restrictions on worship. We will have to see what the Lord has in store.

2. **Holy Communion** - 22 individuals communed (a total of 30 communions) in April, most in the miniservices at St. Peter on Sunday morning. Three (3) shut-ins communed. We will continue to offer communion.

- 3. **Phone Calls** Pastor and a number of members are calling those that we are unable to visit to personally encourage them in their faith and include them in our prayers. Perhaps, you have someone who could use a call from you.
- 4. **Mailings** In addition to the bi-weekly newsletter, all shut-ins and those with limitations on getting out, are now receiving weekly bulletins and sermons mailed to their homes. Anyone may request the same.
- 5. Communication as much as possible by e-mail and internet. At present, we are sending to 40 member e-mails covering 50 to 60 souls. If you have a working e-mail address but have not shared it with St. Peter, please do so so that we can better reach you! If you have internet and do not need our regular printed newsletter mailings, let us know so we can remove you from our mailing list.
- 6. Bible Reading/Study series is available on Proverbs This study series began on 4/13/20 with the first lesson sheet (Chapters 1-9). A second sheet (Chapters 10-14) was made available by 4/19/20. It offers an introduction and a series of questions for each chapter. It is for home use for those reading one chapter per day. Printed copies are available at the church and it is listed under sermons on the St. Peter website. Subsequent lesson sheets will be made available weekly. The Fifth in the series (the last) will be available by May 11<sup>th</sup>. If you would like copies mailed to your home, contact pastor.

7. **Pastor Vacancy**- we have requested a new seminary graduate. **Assignment day is scheduled for May 21**<sup>st</sup> and we will find out at that time if a graduate has been assigned to St. Peter. Please, keep this call and St. Peter's ministry in your prayers.
