## First Lesson Deuteronomy 11:18-21,26-28

18Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. 19Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. 20Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates, 21so that your days and the days of your children may be many in the land that the Lord swore to give your forefathers, as many as the days that the heavens are above the earth. 26See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse- 27the blessing if you obey the

commands of the Lord your God and turn from the way that I command you today by following other gods, which you have not known.

# Psalm 78 (Read Responsively)

- M: O my people, hear my teaching;
- C: listen to the words of my mouth.
- M: I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter hidden things, things from of old-
- C: what we have heard and known, what our fathers have told us.
- M: We will not hide them from their children;
- C: we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord , his power, and the wonders he has done.
- M: He decreed statutes for Jacob
- C: and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our forefathers to teach their children,

# The Second Lesson: Romans 3:21-25a,27,28

21But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. 22This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, 23for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, 24and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. 25God presented him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. 27Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. 28For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law. **Verse Of The Day:** Alleluia. Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path. Alleluia. (Psalm 119:105)

Built On The Rock

Matthew 7:21-29

21"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. 22Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and in your name drive out demons and perform many miracles?' 23Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!' 24"Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. 25The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. 26But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. 27The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash." 28When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were amazed at his teaching, 29because he taught as one who had authority, and not as their teachers of the law.
