
## St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church 1708 West 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue Brodhead, WI 53520

*Introduction:* This is the fifth newsletter since the Corona Virus forced us to discontinue our regular Sunday worship and education hour. *On May 31<sup>st</sup> we were able to resume regular worship services at 9:00 am.* We have done so encouraging our members to observe the safety guidelines suggested by health officials. Worship attendance at the May 31<sup>st</sup> service was 30 (30 communed) followed by 40 and 38 on the following Sundays. *We realize that many still may remain at risk due to health issues and are unable to safely gather.* We will continue to seek to serve all our members.

- 1) *Members who are at risk* are still able to worship through the *internet worship services* offered by other local WELS congregations.
- 2) For those who are unable to make use of the internet services, we are mailing service folders and sermons on a weekly basis. All shut-ins and others who have requested the printed service and sermons will receive them weekly. If you would like your name added to the weekly mailings, please, contact your pastor.
- 3) If you are still "sheltering in place" and would like to receive private communion, please contact your pastor. Pastor Hellwig will continue to serve the congregation until our new pastor is installed on July 19<sup>th</sup>.

Concerning The Pastoral Call/Ordination/Installation: Christ blesses the Christian Church by sending pastors to serve God's people. The Divine Call that this congregation has extended to Pastor Tyler Swiderski to serve in the public ministry on your behalf has established him as pastor of St. Peter Lutheran Church. The formal entrance upon that ministry customarily occurs through the rite of ordination/installation. There is essentially no difference between ordination and installation. Neither ordination nor installation is divinely instituted. However, the custom has ancient roots in the New Testament church in the laying on of hands (Acts 6:6; 13:3; I Timothy 4:14; 5:22). The rite continues to serve the following good purposes: 1) a public testimony of the pastor's fitness for the office; 2) a public confession to pure doctrine and a promise of faithfulness on the part of the pastor; 3) a public recognition of the call for the reassurance of both pastor and congregation; and 4) an intercession by the entire congregation. May you welcome him as Christ's representative in your midst. May the name of the Savior be glorified in all we do!

*Planned Ordination/Installation Service:* St. Peter's new pastor will formally be installed during a special service at 3:00pm on Sunday, July 19, 2020. We will have a guest speaker for this special event and we anticipate that a number of the area pastors will attend to welcome Pastor Swiderski and his wife, Hannah, to the area and to speak a word of blessing. The service will be followed by a fellowship meal at the church. To allow for more room for the fellowship, a large tent will be set to allow us to move outside. The main course for the meal will be purchased. Members are encouraged to bring the remaining dishes. The Ladies Aid will coordinate the efforts for the meal. Notes About Our Regular Worship Services: There are presently no legal restrictions (Covid-19 related) on gathering for worship in Green County or issued by the State of Wisconsin. However, we have begun regular worship services with recommended safety measures in place.

**Social Distancing (Spacing)** – We have marked pews to allow for the <u>recommended 6 feet of spacing between households</u>. Every other pew will be skipped (empty) and we will try to rotate sitting on the ends of pews with the middle (as much as possible) to allow for the recommended separation. (Note that by using every other pew, the pews we use will be  $5\frac{1}{2}$  'apart.) Ushers will help worshippers find seating.

Worship Materials – All service materials (including hymns) will be provided in print for onetime use. (Hymnals have been removed from the pews. You may bring your own hymnal if you have one.)

**Worship Length/Content** – Services will be shortened initially with a more abbreviate liturgy, a sermon and generally only 3 hymns.

Cleaning/Safety – All areas that are used each Sunday will be sanitized during the week. Hand sanitizers, cleaning wipes, and masks will be available. (We are not presently using the Fellowship Hall.) Worshippers are encouraged to wear masks but those that are not comfortable with masks are not required to do so.

Celebrating Holy Communion – We are celebrating on the normal communion Sundays (4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month or when there are five Sundays on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays). We will continue to usher communicants to the fellowship hall in groups of 8 to allow for 'Social

Distancing'. Specific instructions will be given at the services. Those who remain unable to attend regular services may continue to request private communion.

We invite any concerns or suggestions you may have.

Other Worship Opportunities – For those who are presently unable to join us for worship the following WELS area churches will have Sunday sermons and services available online. Please continue to make use of these opportunities to hear the Word! If you have internet connections you can access their web sites – some services will be live-streamed, others wait until after their service to post them on-line.
